1.	What does NTA stand for?	The National Testing Agency (NTA) is established by Ministry of Education, MoE (Earlier known as Ministry of Human Resource Development-MHRD) as an independent/ autonomous, self-reliant and self-sustained premier testing organization.
2.	What is CUET (UG)-2022?	National Testing Agency has been entrusted with the responsibility of conducting the Undergraduate entrance tests for all the Central Universities (CUs) for the academic session 2022-2023. Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG)-2022 will provide a single window opportunity to students to seek admission in any of the Central Universities (CUs) across the country. The Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG)-2022 is being introduced for admission into all UG Programmes in all Central Universities for academic session 2022-23 under the Ministry of Education, (MoE). The Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG)-2022 will provide a common platform and equal opportunities to candidates across the country, especially those from rural and other remote areas and help establish better connect with the Universities. A single Application Form will enable the Candidates to cover a wide outreach and be part of the admissions process to various Central Universities.
3.	What is the mode of exam?	CBT (Computer Based Test).
4.	How is CUET(UG)-2022 going to be helpful to a student	The Common University Entrance Test CUET(UG)- 2022 is going to be helpful to a student in many ways:- I. A student has the option of choosing upto three languages from Section 1A and Section 1B. However, third language chosen should be in lieu of 6 th Domain specific subject. II. In previous years there was a great stress on student to secure more than 95% in Board Examination to get the University of their Choice. With the making of The Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG)-2022, it has now reduced the stress for securing very high marks in the one and only Board Examination. III. The perception that the marks being given by different Boards considerably vary because of the typology of questions and their scoring will be standardised. IV. The Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG)-2022 will be tested through Multiple Choice Questions and therefore this will lead to objective evaluation. This will remove the fear of evaluation in the minds of students, especially when it comes to subjectivity of Examinations. In the CBT format through result processing is done through technology with no human intervention. V. In the perception that The Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG)-2022 will be a part of preparation for Board Exam of Class 12 th since The Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG)- 2022 is going to be tested only through the syllabus of Class 12. VI. In the perception for Board Exam, They can be simplify perception for CUET(UG)- 2022 as a student has the same, the syllabus has what the NCERT and the questions in both cases are multiple choices questions.

How will The Common University Entrance Test CUET(UG)- 2022 address the diversity of the students across the country	The Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG)-2022 will provide a common platform and equal opportunity across the country especially to those students coming from rural and urban areas including candidates in the three National Board CBSE, ICSE and NIOS. It will be held in multiple languages, 13 languages will be used as medium and also 20 languages. All together 33 languages will be tested.												
7.	I secured 99% but did not get admission in the desired university	In the past, candidates had this grievance that though they had scored 99% in various subjects, they could not get admission into the universities of their choice. This was basically because of invariability in terms of testing (the typology of question and scoring of questions. Now, the subjectivity and basis of exams will be removed as the Common University Entrance Test is a Computer Based Test with multiple choice of questions.

Sanskrit (For all Shastri (Undergraduate) courses being offered in Sanskrit, a candidate may choose Sanskrit as the Domain Subject from Section II. 9.	Whether the CUET (UG) – 2022 will be held in a different mediums?	Yes it will be held in 13 Medium as given above.
10.	How will I prepare for both CUET(UG) 2022 and the Board Examinations?	The syllabus of CUET (UG) -2022 is going to be taken only from Class 12th so that there is no pressure on the candidates with regard to extra time and money being spent on preparing for an entrance test. The effort that would be required to do well at the entrance test could also help candidates or students prepare well for their Board Examinations. Thereby, it would strengthen their learning.
11.	What does the National Education Policy Say?	The National Education policy has clearly elucidated that the entrance to Higher Education should be to common entrance test at the national level so that there is uniform standard of bench marking candidates.
12.	Will the Board Exam become redundant now?	Moreover, the Board Exam is not likely to become redundant and the basic eligibility criteria is going to be a key factor for all university and other examinations such as JEE & NEET at the National Level. However, the pressure of taking Board Examination will definitely be reduced. The principles for university entrance exams will be similar. The National Testing Agency (NTA) will work to offer a high-quality common aptitude test, as well as specialized common subject exams in the sciences, humanities, languages, arts and vocational subjects. These exams shall test conceptual understanding and the ability to apply knowledge and shall aim to eliminate the need for taking coaching for these exams. Students will be able to choose the subjects for taking the test, and each university will be able to see each student's individual subject portfolio and admit students into their programmes based on individual interests and talents.
13.	How does CUET (UG)-2022 provide more flexibility and options for me to choose from	A candidate may take maximum of 09 tests in the following manner: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 02 languages from Section IA and Section IB taken together, maximum of 06 Domain Subjects from Section II and General Test from Section III. <p style="text-align: center;">OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Maximum of 03 languages from Section IA and Section IB taken together, maximum of 05 Domain Subjects from Section II and General Test from Section III.
14.	I need to opt for Sanskrit, both as a language and domain specific subject. What do I do?	For all Shastri (Undergraduate) courses being offered in Sanskrit, a candidate may choose Sanskrit as the Domain Subject from Section II. For choosing Sanskrit as Language a candidate may choose Sanskrit from Section IB which will be used for



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		testing their Reading Comprehension (based on different types of passages- Factual, Literary and Narrative. Considering that candidates from different State Boards would be applying for CUET (UG)- 2022, NTA has decided to provide choice in all Sections of question papers, however, the total number of questions to be attempted will remain the same.												
15.	How will performing Arts be tested?	Performing arts Test will have two Parts: Part A which is compulsory will contain General questions and Part B will have Specific Questions related to the Dance/ Music Form opted by the Candidate as per desired University. No. of questions to be attempted will remain the same combining both Parts.

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17.	What will be the level of question for CUET (UG)-2022?	All questions in various testing areas will be benchmarked at the level of Class XII only . Students having studied Class XII Board syllabus would be able to do well in CUET (UG) – 2022.												
18.	How many attempts can I give in CUET (UG)- 2022?	If any University permits students of previous years of class XII to take admission in the current year also, such students would also be eligible to appear in CUET (UG) – 2022.												
19.	What are the choices of Languages and Subjects?	Generally the languages/ subjects chosen should be the ones that a student has opted in his latest Class XII Board examination. However, if any University permits any flexibility in this regards, the same can be exercised under CUET (UG) -2022 also. Candidates must carefully refer to the eligibility requirements of various Central Universities in this regard. Moreover, if the subject to be studied in the Undergraduate course is not available in the list of 27 Domain Specific Subjects being offered the Candidate may choose the Subject closest to his/her choice for e.g. For Biochemistry the candidate may choose Biology.												
20.	How will CUET become a great Social equalizer?	The Common University Entrance Test CUET(UG)-2022will provide a common platform and equal opportunities to candidates across the country, especially those from North-East and from rural and other remote areas and help establish better connect with the Universities. It will test conceptual understanding and the ability to apply knowledge and shall aim to eliminate the need for taking coaching for these exams.												
21.	Where do I fill the Online Application Form?	Online Application Forms for Undergraduate Programmes will open from 02.04.2022, the link for the same will be made available on the official website https://cuet.samarth.ac.in/ . Candidates who wish to appear for CUET (UG) – 2022 are advised to go through the required eligibility of the desired University/ Universities for selecting the options from UG Programmes being offered. The Application will be open from 02.04.2022 to 30.04.2022.												
22.	Will School based Board exams become	No, The basic eligibility criterion for entrance into Universities remains

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	redundant?	unchanged which is that a candidate must have passed the Class XII examination from any recognized Board or equivalent. In fact marks in grade XII for eligibility will vary across programs and Universities. Moreover Board examinations are achievement tests whereas CUET(UG)-2022 is a selection Test.
23.	What will happen if many Candidates get the same scores?	This situation arises in every examination regardless of whether it is a Board Examination, University Entrance Examination or any Professional exam. It is dealt with in the manner and in accordance with rules laid out in the Information Bulletin.
24.	Will this change not be stressful for students of the current batch of class XII as they have mostly studied online due to COVID-19?	The issue has been considered and a decision taken to base the CUET (UG) – 2022 only on the Class XII model NCERT syllabus. Moreover, to ensure that deletion of syllabus across Boards does not impact the Candidate performance in CUET(UG)-2022, overall choice of 10 questions or more is being provided in different Sections.
25.	What about the flexibility and autonomy of Universities? Will it not be curtailed?	The Counselling process is to be conducted by the respective Universities. The Universities will be drawing out their respective merit lists for the offered programmes and may follow the same practice as in earlier years to fill the seats that fall vacant due to dropouts.
26.	What is the Medium of Paper?	The Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG) 2022 will be held in 13 languages as Medium.
27.	The suggested system is less flexible than the admission process organically evolved by Universities over years?	In fact the CUET (UG)-2022 will provide more flexibility to a Candidate, as the candidate can choose upto 9 Subjects from Section 1A and 1B (languages), Section 2 (Domain specific Subjects), Section 3 (General Test).
28.	How will the performance of students taking exam in concerned subjects be compared to those applying for admission with scores of some other allied subjects listed under Section II? For CUET (UG) - 2022	CUET(UG)-2022 has been designed in consonance with NEP where students will be able to choose the subjects for taking the test, and each University will be able to see each student's individual subject scores in subjects and admit students into their programmes based on their score in different subjects and languages.
29.	Will a student be allowed to take exams in several subjects listed under Section II so as to apply to various streams or use their best scores?	Yes a student may take a mix of subjects up to a maximum of 6 subjects in order to apply to different applicable streams that require these subjects for being eligible. Of course they should have studied these subjects at grade XII. They may also take languages (upto 3). In addition they can take the General Test as well. However, the third language chosen needs to be in lieu of 6th domain specific Subject chosen by the candidate - as applicable. (sothe maximum number of tests to be taken remains 9 only i.e. 2 Languages+6 Domain Specific Subjects+1 General Test OR 3 Languages+5 Domain Specific Subjects+1 General Test: flexibility being provided to help a candidate apply for many Universities depending on their eligibility conditions).
30.	Can I submit two application forms for two courses at a time?	An applicant as per eligibility can apply for multiple courses, however a candidate cannot apply for duplicate or multiple Forms for the same course, which may lead to cancellation of all his/her Application Forms.
31.	Can I use my friend's email address when registering for CUET (UG) -2022	No, you need to use a valid and unique email address of applicant only as all communications are through registered e-mail id or SMS. In addition, you will not be able to change or edit the mobile number and email address on the Application Form later as these particulars are fixed.
32.	What documents or certificates do I need to upload along with the Application Form?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Candidates need to upload scanned images of photograph and signature with the Application Form. • Certificates are required to be uploaded along with the Application Form at the time of online submission (PwD, Category, BPL, Class X/XII Equivalence Certificate) <p>The documents / certificates etc., shall be verified directly at the time of admission by the University.</p>

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35.	Is Language compulsory?	A candidate desirous of applying into a particular University will have to follow the required eligibility criteria of the intended University . In case a particular University for its programme requires English or any other Language for instance, the candidate must comply with that. Different Universities may have different language requirements for being eligible.																																
36.	By not including Elective English in Section II, the scheme puts students who have studied Elective English in Class XII to a disadvantage. Elective English (not Core English) should be added to Section II Domain – specific Knowledge and Skills. Elective English in CBSE, unlike Core English, is a literature-based course.	The CUET(UG)-2022 is applicable for all the Boards in the Country. Hence English language is being tested not a particular course of a particular Board. Those who have opted for elective courses have a better chance of faring well.
